

Being part of TASOSS for the past three years has been a great joy and enthralling. Each year, TASOSS beckons its newer heights scaling up the participants and beneficiaries in great numbers. Thence, TASOSS, the state level resource consortium for all the DSSSs in Tamil Nadu and Puduchery, places in record its gratitude for all the men and women who are part of its workforce and who actively brought out many successful milestones in the year past. Their dedicated and invaluable service to the human community is noteworthy.

The year (2021 - 2022) had a joyful beginning as we were freed from the clutches of so many masks that held us in hopelessness and fear. In continuation with the programs designed in the previous year (2020-2021), we opened many new horizons to meet the new social changes and challenges ahead. Apart from the regular plan of action and agenda like empowering and networking various groups under our concern namely Tamil Nadu Women Federation (TWF), Civil Society Organization (CSOs) and the Community Based Organization (CBO), our Project Implementation team (PIT) worked on the phase VII project and updating the same with the DSSSs directions. In collaboration with the State Child protection department and Civil Society Organization, conducted a Webinar on the Child Labour issues and out-comes were appraised in at Vagavasal Gram Panchayat, PMMS Pudkottai and also at 40 villages in Kanyakumari district. The team worked on the Covid - 19 pandemic issues like child labour, psycho social protection of the girl-children, food-relief funds, vaccination, cleanliness and availing the Government aids and it reached 6.75 lakh households with the assistance of the volunteers. Caritas India, in appreciation awarded the team in different categories of the Regional Forum.

Albeit, all our efforts and hard-work, we face the challenge of FCRA amendments which pulls back the pending projects. However, we accommodate accordingly, mainly the programs related to Regional Commission for Migrants with the help of DSSSs. We provide them pastoral care in their psycho-social development that they feel at home with the help of our networking.

- a) Promotion of self-reliant and self-sustaining people's federation for social transformation (2021 - 2022) - NT Phase - VII
 - NT Phase VII project was launched and the Project Implementation team (PIT) was oriented on the Phase VII project objectives and the key output.
 - The Monitoring tool was drafted and shared with the Project implementation team from the field and it was pre-tested at Vagavasal Gram Panchayat, PMSSS Pudukottai.
 - The Project Implementation Team consolidated and finalized on the target area for the project. Accordingly, ZONE wise Consolidation and finalization of Panchayats and associated villages were completed.
 - Multi stakeholders (MSHs) were identified across the 19 DSSS location by the project implementation team and their profile was created. These MSHs were given training on the Village Panchayat Development Plan (VPDP) processes and monitoring the approved VPDP and its implementation in their respective Panchayats. The workshop was facilitated by
 - New DSSs Directors were oriented and updated on the projects and leadership qualities. The current development scenario and way-forward in the context of pandemic situation was discussed.

- In association with the State Child protection department and civil society organizations organized Webinar: focusing on Action to end CHILD LABOUR-TN Child Rights Watch / SCPS, TN / CCRD(Centre for Child Rights & Development). The Children parliament representatives from all the DSSSs and staff participated and were updated on the concept by experts.
- A Webinar to create awareness for the children on the Menstrual Hygiene Management was organized which was benefited by many children across all the DSSS.
- The process of federating the Children parliament across the state was facilitated and to kick start the process a webinar on the district level election process was organized and facilitated by the team.

Govt schemes availed consolidation across 19 DSSSs **CB0** members:

- During this reporting period 10748 families availed the various Govt schemes both central and state to a tune of 37 million worth funds.
- In the context of the present pandemic nearly 2400 individuals were vaccinated with the facilitation of our staff in Vagavasal panchayat of Pudukottai District. Similar effort are being taken up in all the panchayats by our MSHs to coordinate with the government departments. Medical aid direct to home introduced by state government was availed by more than 2000 of our target people in all the Gram panchayats.











Networking / alliance building / volunteer engagement:

- Petitions were given in the Gram Sabha meetings of Ponnimanthurai of Dindigul district, Vadasithur of Coimbatore district and many other Gram Panchayats to problems related to roads, anganwadi and cremation ground etc.
- An application was submitted in the Gram Sabha meeting to Cleaning and Deepening the pond in Mathur panchayat of Kuzhithurai DSSS which is in process. More than 5 children in this panchayat were deprived of regular nutritious food from the Anganwadi center which was addressed with the support of our MSH intervention to the particular anganwadi.

b) Regional for accompaniment programme

- TNRSP document was approved by the TASOSS General body and was published on 3rd Sep 2021 and as a follow-up to that 3 DSSSs representing 3 Zones are now under facilitation in the development of Diocesan/DSSS Strategic Plan.
- TNRSP Rollout interventions were carried out CMSSS and DMSSS with its key stakeholders and were oriented on TNRSP followed by evolving a core committee to steer the process of evolving Diocesan Strategic Plan.



- Represented as Child Right's Network and contributed in the regional consultation on evolving plan of action towards realization of Tamil Nadu State Policy for Children 2021 on 15th Mar 2022 organized by Department of Social Defence, Government of Tamil Nadu, Thozhamai and UNICEF.
- The Caritas National Assembly of Tamil Nadu Region was conducted at CMSSS

Mainstreaming KSPs among the DSSSs

- DSSS Directors got orientations on Laudato Si Recommendations & Green Diocese/Garden of Eden Concepts in the DSSSs and Fratelli Tutti, and adopting/reflecting the learned 'Catholic Social Teachings' in their projects and program implementation.
- KSPs with its detailed indicators were translated into Tamil, printed and disseminated to all the 27 DSSSs and Diocese level launch of TNRSP was completed in 3 Dioceses DMSSS, CMSSS and SMSSS

- 108 FBOs contact addresses were collected with the help of Tamil Nadu Pondicherry Christian Religious Institutions (TNPCRI) which will be used to propel the TNRSP, initiate network actions.

Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE)-June 2021-Nov 2021

- 1350 Volunteers were identified in the RCCE program who were sensitized on COVID Appropriate Behavior(CAB), reached 6.75 lakh Households disseminating information on hand wash, importance of wearing mask, physical distancing and vaccination
- Caritas India recognized and awarded for different categories based on the results of the project.

Covid 19 -safe program for protecting children in 40 villages of Kanyakumari district of Tamil Nādu (Phase I) -June 2021 - Jan 2022

- In Kanyakumari District 4 Diocesan Social Service Societies (DSSSs) operating in different locations are in coordination with the Child Care Institutions (CCIs) run by their respective Dioceses. The children who have been residing in Child Care Institutions have returned back to their families during this pandemic. Nearly 800 children have returned to their families currently but encountering many difficulties to survive. The most affected are the girl children who are more than 75% of the total returned children not in a position to ensure their reasonable health and hygiene. Especially the Menstrual Hygiene management of the children is at stake that needs to be addressed.
- This intervention is supported financially and technically by CRS and implemented by TASOSS with the coordination and support from 4 Diocesan Social Service Societies (DSSSs) in Kanyakumari Viz. KKSSS, MIDS, KSSS and KIDSS. The support benefited nearly 800 vulnerable children and their families and children and care takers in residential care.
- Cash support of Rs.1000 to girl children (600 Nos) and Rs.900 to Boy children (200 Nos) per month during the lockdown period, who returned from CCIs and vulnerable children in Kanyakumari District.
- Parallelly Virtual monitoring for tracking the health, psycho-social and protection needs of the children in communities and awareness on COVID safe behavior and child protection in COVID context by the volunteers from the DSSS.

E) Flood relief support in 4 DSSS areas of Kanyakumari district

- Two Vulnerable households in Kuzhithurai DSSS locality who were allotted land for house construction by the village panchayat since they have lost their house and belongings during the Kanyakumari floods. through the panchayat. TASOSS with the funding support from CRS helped these 2 families in constructing a decent house for their living.
- 110 Toilets in the households which were washed away were renovated and cleaned in Kottar and MIDS DSSS locality with the funding support from CRS.
- 50 families were provided with hygiene and safety kits who were affected by the floods.









CHANGING THE WAY WE CARE (CTWWC) F)

CAMPAIGN FOR STRENGTHENING THE FAMILIES OF KANYAKUMARI DISTRICT. (PHASE II) - Feb 2022 - Sept 2022



Changing The Way We Care (CTWWC) is an alliance of multiple consortium members including two partners (Catholic Relief Services and Maestral International) and three donors (MacArthur Foundation, USAID and the GHR Foundation). CTWWC implements within a context of a growing global understanding that institutional care of children is a significant challenge that does not allow children to reach their full potential.



Campaign location

Kanyakumari District covers four Diocesan Social Service Societies (DSSSs) namely, Kuzhithurai (KIDS), Marthandam (MIDS), Kottar (KSSS) and Thakkalay (KKSSS). On the whole 43 villages are targeted to carry out the campaign activities. Each DSSS will work in 10 villages each while Kottar DSSS will work in 3 additional villages in order to include more vulnerable children from coastal region. The villages were selected as part of the Virtual Monitoring initiative during COVID response. These

villages were mapped and identified as campaign location considering that most children sent to CCI and most Children returned from CCIs during COVID Pandemic.



- To bring about willingness among the families to care for and protect children in their own families or through an alternative system of family care.
- To capacitate the key influencers to enable them to bring about Social and Behaviour changes (SBCC) in the community towards family strengthening.
- To converge the relevant and potential stakeholders to synergize their actions to support and expedite the process of strengthening families in the community.

Focus of the Campaign:

- Positive parenting such as communication patterns, disciplinary style, and teaching style.
- Enhanced Knowledge about the milestones of growth and development of children
- Support in times of need- Support during physical, mental, and emotional need or breakdown
- Resilience in handling children-Resilience is the ability to function well and manage stress during times of adversity, challenges, and trauma.
- Parents as Role models-Children mimic adults.

G) ESTABLISHMENT OF MIGRATION FACILITATION CENTERS (8DSSS)

SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS - 2021-2022

- More than 1300 Migrants from 40 villages in 8 DSSS were identified and collected migrant data base through KOBO Tool app. 16 Migration Facilitation Centre (MFCs) at 8 DSSSs locations were formed and functioning as an information hub for updating the information related to in and out migrants of the location.
- The skill building and up gradation training programmes of the state & central Government and different skills training institutions running by Government/Non-GovernmentInstitutions are linked.
- 18 diocesan secretaries and 5 from Religious Congregations in the Tamil Nadu region were appointed as the respective regional secretaries for Migration commission at Dioceses level.
- In the second year additional 5 villages in the target areas were selected and started 2 sub centers were set up. 1263 new migrants in the selected villages were identified and their data were collected using KOBO Mobile Application.



Details on a few skill trainings completed across the DSSSs are given below:

- USSS Migrant Facilitation Centre trained 13 migrants on Four wheeler driving skills.
- SSSS, Santhome Migrant Facilitation Centre trained 40 migrants on Tailoring skills.
- Kottar Migrant Facilitation Centre trained 15 migrants on Ari work skills
- Madurai Migrant Facilitation Centre trained 40 Migrants ontailoring skills.
- Kanyakumari Migration Facilitation Centre trained 15 migrants on Value added products skills by National Skill Development Board, Thiruvananthapuram
